- 1. I have something that needs to be fixed in my apartment, what do I do?
 - a. Submit a work order through the Resident Portal app or website. If it is a water intrusion/HVAC issue please call the emergency number (850.479.6257) and leave a message.
- 2. <u>I have guests coming over this weekend where should they park?</u>
 - Guests and visitors are required to park where there is rocks/gravel.
 Parking passes are for residents only.
- 3. My rent might be late this month who should I contact?
 - a. Rent is due on the 1st and late on the 4th. After the 4th of the month
 you will be blocked from paying online and a \$100 late fee will be
 applied. We allow one payment arrangement per lease period.
 Contact the office as soon as you know rent will be late.
- 4. <u>I see someone has a Reserved parking space how do I get one?</u>
 - Reserved parking spaces are provided to individuals who submit a
 reasonable accommodation form and are approved by corporate.
 Residents who park in a reserved space and are not the approved
 resident will be towed at the car owner's expense.

Spread the Love in Your Neighborhood

Avoid loud activities - such as vacuuming, hanging décor or exercising - early in the morning or late at night.

Keep up curb appeal - Keeping the visible parts of your home tidy will help everyone take pride in their community. Make sure window coverings are in good condition, and report maintenance issues, inside and out, as soon as you notice them. Throw trash always in the proper places, and leave common areas clean.

Chocolate Strawberry Cake Show that special person in your life just how sweet they are, with this delicious

Show that special person in your life just how sweet they are, with this delicious chocolate cake topped with fresh strawberries!

Instructions

 Prepare the Cake Layers: Preheat oven to 350°F. Grease and flour 3 (8-inch) round cake pans; set aside. Place chopped chocolate in a small heatproof bowl; pour boiling water over chocolate. Whisk until chocolate is melted and smooth. Let stand until cooled to room temperature, about 20 minutes.

- 2. Beat butter with a heavy-duty stand mixer fitted with a paddle attachment on medium speed until creamy, about 1 minute. Gradually add granulated sugar and brown sugar, beating until light and fluffy, 3 to 4 minutes. Add egg yolks 1 at a time, beating until just blended after each addition. Add vanilla and cooled melted chocolate, beating until blended. Whisk together flour, cocoa, baking soda, and salt in a separate bowl. Add flour mixture to butter mixture alternately with buttermilk, beginning and ending with flour mixture, beating on low speed until just blended after each addition.
- 3. Beat egg whites in a separate bowl with an electric mixer on medium speed until soft peaks form, about 5 minutes. Gently fold into chocolate batter. Pour batter evenly into prepared pans
- 4. Bake in preheated oven until a wooden pick inserted in centers of Cake Layers comes out clean, 20 to 30 minutes. Cool in pans on wire racks 10 minutes. Remove Cake Layers from pans; let cool completely on wire racks, about 40 minutes.
- i. Prepare the Frosting: Beat butter with a heavy-duty stand mixer fitted with a paddle attachment on medium speed until creamy, about 1 minute. Gradually add powdered sugar, vanilla, salt, and 2 tablespoons of the chopped strawberries, beating on medium speed until mixture is creamy with streaks of strawberries throughout. Increase speed to medium-high; beat until light and fluffy, about 1 minute. Gently fold in remaining strawberries.
- 6. Place 1 Cake Layer on a platter; spread about 1/2 cup Frosting over top of layer. Repeat process with 1 additional Cake Layer and 1/2 cup Frosting. Top with remaining Cake Layer; spread remaining Frosting over top and sides of cake. Garnish with whole and halved strawberries.



<u>Ingredients</u>

- Vegetable shortening, for greasing pans
- 1 (4-oz.) semisweet chocolate baking bar, chopped
- ½ cup boiling water
- 1 cup (8 oz.) salted butter, softened
- 1 cup granulated sugar
- 1 cup packed light brown sugar
- 4 large eggs, separated
- 1 teaspoon vanilla extract
- 2 cups (about 8 1/2 oz.) all-purpose flour, plus more for pans



¼ cup unsweetened cocoa

1 teaspoon baking soda

1 teaspoon table salt

1 cup whole buttermilk

1 cup (8 oz.) salted butter, softened

6 cups (about 11/2 lb.) unsifted powdered sugar

1 teaspoon vanilla extract

¼ teaspoon table salt

 ½ cup chopped fresh strawberries (from 6 whole strawberries), divided

Whole and halved fresh strawberries

"History has shown us the courage can be contagious, and hope can take on a life of its own" - Michelle Obama

Black History Month was created to focus attention on the contributions of African Americans to the United States. It honors all Black people from all periods of U.S. history, from the enslaved people first brought over from Africa in the early 17th century to African Americans living in the United States today.

Among the notable figures often spotlighted during Black History Month are Dr. Martin Luther King, Jr., who fought for equal rights for Blacks during the 1950s and '60s; Thurgood Marshall, the first African-American justice appointed to the United States Supreme Court in 1967; Mae Jemison, who became the first female African-American astronaut to travel to space in 1992; and Barack Obama, who was elected the firstever African-American president of the United States in 2008.

Since the first Negro History Week in 1926, other countries have joined the United States in celebrating Black people and their contribution to history and culture, including Canada, the United Kingdom, Germany, and the Netherlands. Today Black History Month continues the discussion of Black people and their contributions through activities such as museum exhibits and film screenings, and by encouraging the study of achievements by African Americans year-round.





Let the Good Times Roll! Mardi Gras 2024

Mardi Gras is French for "Fat Tuesday", reflecting the practice of the last night of consuming rich, fatty foods in preparation for the fasting season of Lent. The festival season varies from city to city, as some traditions, such as the one in New Orleans, Louisiana, consider Mardi Gras to stretch the entire period from Twelfth Night (the last night of Christmas which begins Epiphany) to Ash Wednesday. Others treat the final three-day period before Ash Wednesday as the Mardi Gras.

In Mobile, Alabama, Mardi Gras-associated social events begin in November, followed by mystic society balls New Year's Eve, followed by parades and balls in January and February, celebrating up to midnight before Ash Wednesday.
