New Year, New You, New Budget

Budgeting is never easy. There's always going to be something we want to buy but don't need or emergencies that require pulling from our reserves. But with the right budgeting method, your life and finances can run more smoothly! Try one of these simple budgets for the new year:

50/30/20 - If you don't have a specific focus, give this smart structure a try. Split your income up as follow:

50% towards necessities, 30% on wants, and 20% on dept repayment and savings. Great for beginner budgeters, this method can be tailored to fit your needs by changing the percentages.

Pay Yourself First - If you don't like crunching numbers but need to focus on savings and debt repayment, this is a great option. In this method, you can put money aside for savings and debt repayment first, then spend the rest of the money as you see fit without tracking every purchase. Be careful. though. You want to make sure you still have enough for bills and other necessary expenses.

Zero-Based Budget - If you love planning, then this strategy is perfect for you. Using a simple equation - income minus expenses equal zero- this method makes use of every dollar by allotting all your income to specific spending categories, such as groceries, entertainment, and savings.

Need a More Concrete Approach? - Try the envelope system!

Also known as cash stuffing, this method is just like the zero based budget, but with actual paper envelopes in cash.

Don't Give Up!

It may take a few months for a budget to stick; it's all about habit building. Give yourself some flexability, and change methods if you find one system isn't working for you.

Bangers & Mash

Take a hop across the pond with us for this delicious pub dish straight out of the U.K!

Traditionally served with onion gravy feel free to spice it up and change to your liking.

Instructions

- 1. Preheat the oven to 400 degrees F.
- 2. Make the onion gravy in advance. Caramelized onions with a little Worcestershire squee take it to the next level!
- 3. To Make the Mash: Place the potatoes in a pot of water and add the salt. Bring to a boil, lower the heat to a steady simmer and cook for about 15-20 minutes or until they potatoes are just tender when pierced with a knife. Be careful not to over-boil
- 4. Thoroughly drain the potatoes and place them back in the empty pot set over very low heat just to maintain warmth. If using a ricer or food mill (this creates the most optimal texture), run the potatoes through it now while they're hot. If using a hand masher mash the potatoes while they're hot. (Avoid using an electric mixer or food processor.) Mash the potatoes until fluffy and you've reached the desired degree of smoothness. Be careful not to over-mash or the potatoes will become gluey.
- 5. Use a spoon to stir in the butter. Once melted stir in the hot milk gradually, allowing time for the potatoes to absorb the liquid after each addition. Add more hot milk as needed to achieve desired consistency. Season with salt and pepper to taste.
- 6. To Prepare the Sausages: While the potatoes are boiling place the sausages in a baking dish with a little oil and roast the sausages for about 10 minutes on each side or until nicely browned. (Alternatively you can fry the sausages but baking them creates an especially nice crispy outer shell with a juicy interior.)
- 7. To serve, place a mound of mashed potatoes on each plate, lay the sausages on the mashed potatoes and top with onion gravy. Peas are a traditional side.





<u>Ingredients</u>

- 8 high quality pork sausages (pork is traditional but if you don't eat pork you can use chicken sausages, etc)
- 2 pounds Yukon Gold or other medium-starch potato, peeled and cut into large (2 inch) uniform chunks (or boiled whole in skins and peeled while hot)
- 1/2 teaspoon salt
- 4 tablespoons unsalted butter
- 3/4 to 1 cup hot milk (we recommend whole but you can use 2%)
- 1 batch homemade onion gravy














A Day ON, Not a Day Off

"Our lives begin to end the day we become silent about the things that matter" - Dr. Martin Luther King Jr.


In the United States, Martin Luther King, Jr., Day is observed annually on the third Monday in January. The day commemorates the life and work of Dr. King, who was a Baptist minister and prominent leader in the American civil rights movement. He rose to the front of the civil rights movement in 1955 with the Montgomery bus boycott that followed the arrest of Rosa Parks, an African American woman who had violated the city's racial segregation ordinances when she refused to give her seat on a bus to a white passenger. An advocate of Mahatma Gandhi's philosophy of using nonviolent resistance to effect social change. King promoted the use of nonviolent means to bring an end to racial segregation in the United States. In 1964 he was awarded the Nobel Prize for Peace for his efforts. He was assassinated in 1968.

People are encouraged to use the day to "reflect on the principles of racial equality and nonviolent social change espoused by Dr. King." The holiday is typically observed with events such as marches and rallies and speeches by politicians and civil rights leaders.



National Human Trafficking Prevention Month

President Biden has proclaimed January 2023 as "National Human Trafficking Prevention Month," reaffirming his Administration's commitment to protect and empower survivors of all forms of human trafficking, to prosecute traffickers, and to bring an end to human trafficking in the United States and around the world. "Since human trafficking disproportionately impacts racial and ethnic minorities, women and girls, LGBTQI+ individuals, vulnerable migrants, and other historically marginalized and underserved communities, our mission to combat human trafficking must always be connected to our broader efforts to advance equity and justice across our society." Trafficking in persons is a serious crime and a grave violation of human rights. Every year, thousands of men, women and children fall into the hands of traffickers, in their own countries and abroad. Almost every country in the world is affected by trafficking, whether as a country of
